

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

THE CENTER FOR PUBLIC INTEGRITY

TO: The D.C. Department of Consumer Regulatory Affairs
Washington, D.C.

We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or more, acting as incorporators, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation pursuant to the District of Columbia Non-Profit Corporation Act:

FIRST: The name of the corporation is THE CENTER FOR PUBLIC INTEGRITY.

SECOND: The period of duration is perpetual and the corporation shall have members.

THIRD: The corporation is organized and will be operated exclusively for the charitable and educational purposes of bringing a higher standard of integrity to the American political process and to government through informing and educating the public about critical issues of integrity. In pursuance of these purposes it shall have the powers to do all things necessary, proper and consistent with maintaining its tax exempt status under section 501 (c) (3). All references to sections in these Articles refer to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as amended or to comparable sections of subsequent internal revenue laws.

FOURTH: No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributed to any director, employee or other individual, partnership, estate, trust or corporation having a personal or private interest in the corporation. Compensation for services actually rendered and reimbursement for expenses actually incurred in attending to the affairs of this corporation shall be limited to reasonable amounts. No part of the activities of this corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation to an extent that would disqualify it for tax exemption under Section 501(c) (3), and this corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles or of any By-laws adopted thereunder, this corporation shall not take any action not permitted by the laws which then apply to this corporation.

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FIFTH: The internal affairs of the corporation shall be regulated by its Board of Directors as described in the By-laws. Upon dissolution of the corporation, its assets shall be disposed of exclusively for the purposes of the corporation or distributed to such organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes which shall, at the time, qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3).

SIXTH: The registered agent is Gail M. Harmon, and the address, including street and number, of its initial registered office is 2001 S Street, N.W., Suite 430, Washington, D.C. 20009.

SEVENTH: The number of directors constituting the initial Board of Directors is three, and the names and addresses, including street number, of the persons who are to serve as the initial directors until the first annual meeting, or until their successors are elected and qualified, are:



Pursuant to, and in the manner prescribed by, the provisions of the District of Columbia Nonprofit Corporation Act, the undersigned has adopted the following Articles of Amendment to its Articles of Incorporation.

FIRST: The name of the Corporation is: **THE CENTER FOR PUBLIC INTEGRITY.**

SECOND: The following amendment to Article Three of the Articles of Incorporation was adopted by the Corporation in the manner prescribed by the District of Columbia Nonprofit Corporation Act: Amending article Third in it's entirety.

The corporation is organized and operated exclusively for the charitable and educational purposes (within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code) of enhancing public access to information, including:

- bringing a higher standard of integrity to the political process and to government through informing and educating the public about critical issues of integrity;
- facilitating the general public's access to information from worldwide government and non government sources on issues of vital relevance to all people;
- studying and disseminating information about the integrity of public and private institutions, their responsiveness to important social, environmental, and economic problems, and the effectiveness of government programs designed to address these problems;
- studying and disseminating information about the application and enforcement of existing laws and regulations, including analysis of people, institutions, and forces which interfere with effective application or enforcement and/or advocate against strengthening these laws and regulations; and
- encouraging and assisting in the dissemination of government information and documents.

Under the provisions of the Title 29 of D.C. Code (Business Organizations Act), the domestic filing entity listed below hereby applies for a Certificate of Amendment and for that purpose submits the statement below.

2. The text of each amendment adopted.

Article Third is hereby amended to read, "The corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes (within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or comparable sections of subsequent internal revenue laws) including, without limitation: -investigative reporting to protect democracy and inspire change by exposing betrayals of public trust by powerful interests, public and private; -investigative reporting to bring a higher standard of integrity to the political process and to government through informing and educating the public about critical issues of integrity; -investigative reporting of public and private institutions in relation to important social, economic and other problems, their responsiveness to these problems and the effectiveness of government and private programs intended to address these problems; and -investigative reporting to enhance public access to information from worldwide government and non government sources on issues of vital relevance to all people. In furtherance of these purposes, the corporation shall have the powers to do all things necessary, proper and consistent with maintaining its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or comparable sections of subsequent internal revenue laws."

3. If the amendment provides for an exchange, reclassification, or cancellation of memberships, provisions for implementing the amendment.
